Inventory of Stone Tool and Ethnobotany Collections (the Green Boxes)

Stone tools and ethnobotany samples have generally been given a two digit designation. The first digit is a number (1-6), which corresponds to the box in which the specimen is kept. Boxes generally have a coherent theme, such as Olowan Tools, etc, and will ideally be checked out as a whole (i.e., rather than checking out individual specimens from various boxes). The second digit is a letter identifying types within each box. Note that two or more specimens of the same type will have the same designation. Boxes 5 and 6 are mixed odds and ends that are largely unnumbered.

Inventorying this collection requires looking through each box to verify that all of the specimens are present. This is one of the more time-consuming inventories.
