MELISSA HAGUE FIELD STUDY AWARD**

The Melissa Hague Field Study Award supports anthropology students (graduate or undergraduate) for off-campus fieldwork. The award was established in 1999 to honor the memory of the late Melissa Hague, a student majoring in anthropology who, at the time of her death, was anticipating her first fieldwork. Her family hopes the Melissa Hague Field Study Award will help generations of UGA students reach their goals by directly supporting field research or supplementing existing field research funds. Undergraduate and graduate applications will be evaluated separately.

APPLICATION DEADLINE IS JANUARY 23, 2023 BY 5:00 P.M.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The applicant must be a graduate or undergraduate student in good standing majoring in anthropology at the University of Georgia.

PROPOSAL FORMAT

The proposal must adhere to the following format; those that do not will not be considered. **Please note the page limits on each section.**

- Page 1 - Application Cover Sheet
- Pages 2-3
 - Summary of the research objectives and fieldwork, citing relevant literature
 - Discussion of methods, procedures, and expected results
 - Budget. Give details of costs for supplies, transportation, lodging, and other expenses directly related to the field project. **Please confirm that expenses are allowable by UGA.**
 - Expected schedule for completion of the fieldwork and the overall project.
- Pages 4-x
 - Unofficial transcript. Applicants may obtain their unofficial transcript from Athena.

The proposal should be in twelve-point type, single-spaced, and with one-inch margins. Students applying for multiple departmental awards need only submit one proposal as long as it is clear in the research summary why the proposed research qualifies for each award.

Submit the proposal to anthro@uga.edu by **January 23, 2023** at **5:00pm**. Applications will be reviewed by the departmental awards committee, which will select finalists on the basis of proposal quality and an applicant's academic performance and professional promise. The departmental awards committee and department head reserve the right to determine the dollar amount awarded.
